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

ORDINANCE NO. 1928

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMOND, WASHINGTON, AMENDING CHAPTER 2.40 OF THE RAYMOND MUNICIPAL CODE DEALING WITH COMPENSATION OF ELECTIVE OFFICERS

WHEREAS, the City of Raymond has established a compensation of elective officers; and

WHEREAS, it is recognized that the activities and projects of the City of Raymond have increased since the passage of the most recent Ordinance #1909 governing the City of Raymond's pay structure for the elected position of Mayor,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RAYMOND, WASHINGTON AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1. Section 2.40.010 Compensation of Elective Officers</u>, is hereby amended to read as follows:

The salary of the mayor shall be in the sum of \$1,500.00 per month.

SECTION 2. If any portion of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional for any reason, such finding shall not affect the remainder of the ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and effective January 1, 2024.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF RAYMOND SETTING THE PROPERTY TAX LEVY FOR THE YEAR 2024 AS REQUIRED BY RCW 84.55.120

WHEREAS, the City of Raymond of Pacific County has met and considered its budget for the calendar year <u>2024</u>; and

WHEREAS, the City of Raymond's actual levy amount from the previous year was **§526,562.00**; and

This increase is exclusive of additional revenue resulting from new construction, improvements to property, newly constructed wind turbines, solar, biomass, and geothermal facilities, and any increase in the value of state assessed property, any annexations that have occurred and refunds made.
